**CONSTRUCTION NOTICE #12: Queens Quay Revitalization
Stage One: Week of August 20th to August 24th 2012**

BELL

Starting Tuesday, August 21, Aecon (Bell's construction contractor) will begin copper and fibre cable installations for 200, 245, 250 and 260 Queens Quay. This work is expected to be complete by the end of the week.

These new cables will be drawn from the Bell manhole that is closest to each building. The manhole for 245, 250/260 Queens Quay is located on the sidewalk area in front of the Rabba grocery store. The manhole for 200 Queens Quay (the parking garage for 208, 218 Queens Quay) is located in the sidewalk area just west of York St.

What to Expect:

Aecon is expected to begin at the manhole for 245, 250/260 Queens Quay. Crews will park their truck in the westbound curb lane adjacent to the sidewalk. New copper and fibre cables will be pulled from the truck via a tripod and pulley assembly over the manhole and directed via ducts to each building. Once complete, the truck and crew will move to the manhole for 200 Queens Quay.

Pedestrian and Vehicle Access:

Traffic barrels and fast fence will be installed in the work zone. There will be minimal pedestrian disruption as crews will be predominately working from the adjacent traffic lane. One westbound lane of Queens Quay will be closed to vehicular traffic at each location. Paid duty police officers will be on site as necessary to direct traffic.

TTC

TTC crews will continue their work within the Harbourfront Portal. Work includes the removal of the overhead wiring on the portal's exit/entry ramp located just west of Bay Street. TTC trucks and crews will occupy the track right-of-way and ramp area during this work.

LOOK AHEAD: UPCOMING WORK

- Bell: Cable installations are scheduled for 207 Queens Quay and expected to start on Monday, August 27th.
- TTC: Construction and remediation work will continue in the Harbourfront Portal.
- Toronto Hydro: When Toronto Hydro obtains its permits for work, the "locate of services" will begin on Queens Quay.
