CONSTRUCTION NOTICE #12: Martin Goodman Trail Connection & Jarvis Dockwall Reinforcement

Stage One: Week of December 24, 2012 to January 11, 2013

Jarvis Dockwall Reinforcement

The drill rig continues the installation of the rock anchor for the tie-backs on the dockwall.

All crews will now break for the holiday season beginning December 24th, and will resume work on Wednesday, January 2nd.

What to Expect:

There will be minimal truck activity in and out of the site during these next few weeks, and no major traffic impacts are expected. Some construction noise can be expected. Pedestrian access will be maintained at all times.

Interim Martin Goodman Trail Connection

Construction is progressing at a rapid pace on the new stretch of Martin Goodman Trail. The project is now 95% complete. Lane painting and bike chevrons will be applied to the stretch of Queens Quay (east of Yonge Street to Parliament Street) in the first week of January, weather permitting.

Over the next couple of weeks, two TTC laybys (for passenger loading and unloading) will be built on the south side of Queens Quay at Freeland Street and at Lower Jarvis Street. New signage for these laybys, the Martin Goodman Trail, and cyclists will be placed in the New Year.

What to Expect:

Some minor construction and equipment noise can be expected when the remaining work resumes in the New Year (within the City's Construction Noise Bylaw).

Pedestrian and Vehicle Access:

Traffic barrels will be used to mark these localized work areas and their progress along Queens Quay. All driveways will be maintained during construction. Pedestrian access will be maintained with alternative diversion paths provided.

TORONTO HYDRO

Toronto Hydro will continue with their rebuild of several cable chambers on the southside of Queens Quay, east of Yonge Street. Shoring has been installed to support the ground as crews work to rebuild these chambers.

Dewatering activities for this area has begun with the placement of pumps and settling tanks which are located at the foot of Yonge Street. Fast fence has been erected around the work zone, and traffic barrels have been placed to divert vehicles from this area.

Pedestrian and Vehicle Access:

A short stretch of the eastbound curb lane is closed to traffic as crews work in the Yonge and Queens Quay area. Traffic barrels currently mark this localized work area. Pedestrian access will be maintained with alternative diversion paths provided.

LOOK AHEAD: UPCOMING WORK

- Eastern/Waterfront Toronto: No work is schedule for the week of December 24th. Dockwall reinforcement work resumes – Wednesday, January 2nd.
- Martin Goodman Trail Connection: Final paving work at Yonge Street pending completion of Toronto Hydro work in this area. Lane painting and signage to occur first week of January 2013.
- Toronto Hydro: Continue to work on cable chambers and dewatering wells.
