CONSTRUCTION NOTICE #5: Jack Layton Ferry Terminal and Harbour Square Park

March Construction Activities

Throughout the month of March, construction crews continued to focus their efforts on completing the south end of the promenade.

Crews have now completed the installation of soil cells, tree infrastructure, planting soil, tree rings and trench drains on the south end of the promenade. Foundations for the new light poles have also been completed, as well as the new concrete stairs that will lead visitors from the main promenade up to the Jack Layton Memorial Statue.

April Construction Activities

With much of the southern portion ready for paving to begin, construction has shifted to the north end of the promenade with crews focused on completing site removals and sub-surface infrastructure this month.

Installation of soil cells, tree infrastructure, planting soil, tree rings and trench drains are scheduled to begin shortly on the north end of the promenade. Crews will also complete the remaining light pole foundations and associated electrical work.

The installation of paving at the south end of the promenade will begin next week.

During construction, trucks will periodically need to cross the Queens Quay pedestrian promenade and the Martin Goodman Trail at Bay Street in order to enter and exit the construction site. During these times, flagmen will be on site to safely direct pedestrians and cyclists.
