**CONSTRUCTION UPDATE #4: Queens Quay Revitalization  
Stage One**

The following construction activities are scheduled for the week of June 25<sup>th</sup> to June 29<sup>th</sup>, 2012.

**BELL**

- **Construction Activity:**  
Last week, Aecon Utilities, (Bell's construction contractor) substantially completed all scheduled activities including directional boring at Lower Simcoe Street and Queens Quay. Crews were also able to complete the planned street crossings on the east and west side of Lower Simcoe Street, ahead of schedule. This allowed crews to start directional boring along the east side of Robertson Crescent (near the Radisson Hotel) on Thursday, June 21<sup>st</sup>. This work is expected to be complete by end of day Monday, June 25<sup>th</sup> marking the end of directional boring activities for Bell's work.
- **What to Expect:**  
From Thursday, June 21 through Monday, June 25, directional boring equipment will be positioned on the east leg of Robertson Crescent at the south east curb. Directional boring will be directed from the south across the street (subsurface) to the north side of the street near Jaipur Indian Express. Several 6" orange coloured HDPE (high-density polyethylene) Bell conduits will be installed in the ground for future cabling operations.

When this work is complete, directional boring machines will be removed. At that point, crews will begin to attach – or tie-in – the newly installed conduit to Bell hand wells (small below grade chambers that connect to Bell's underground network of conduit). Tie-in work will continue into early July in the same zones where directional boring work occurred.

In addition, some minor surface repairs and restoration work is also scheduled for later in the week.

When crews are working, they will cordon off small sections of pedestrian sidewalks and traffic lanes, as necessary. Intermittent noise should be expected from the cutting and drilling activities between the hours of 8am to 5pm each day.

- **Pedestrian Access:**  
Fast fence will be erected by Aecon crews around all their work areas. However, pedestrian access will be maintained with diversion paths provided. Paid duty Toronto police officers will also be on site directing pedestrian traffic, if necessary.
- **Vehicle Access:**  
Localized single lane closures may occur as Aecon undertakes its work. Barrels and temporary barriers with signage will be erected to divert traffic. Paid duty Toronto police officers will also be on site directing vehicle traffic when necessary.

**Upcoming Work:**

- For the shortened week of July 2<sup>nd</sup>, Aecon crews will continue their remedial civil work along Queens Quay.
