**CONSTRUCTION UPDATE #7: Queens Quay Revitalization  
Stage One**

Some minor construction activities are scheduled for the week of July 16<sup>th</sup> to July 20<sup>th</sup> 2012.

**BELL**

Aecon (Bell's construction contractor) completed their civil work on Friday, July 6. However, following the completion of their work, two conduit obstructions were discovered requiring additional work at 231 and 235 Queens Quay. Aecon has completed the work at 231 Queens Quay and will schedule the work at 235 Queens Quay once approvals are in place. In addition, Bell's line crew – Distinct Cabling will begin due diligence work in preparation for its cabling operations for the newly installed infrastructure.

*What to Expect:*

Distinct Cabling crews will open various manholes on Queens Quay to prove that the newly installed conduit and duct system is ready to receive new runs of copper and fibre cables.

*Pedestrian and Vehicle Access:*

There will be limited and localized traffic lane restrictions. These areas will be marked by orange cones and have short time durations of approximately one hour. There will be no obstructions or restrictions to pedestrian access.

*Upcoming Work:*

For the week of July 23rd, Bell is expected to continue developing its cabling schedule. Once the schedule is complete, further communication will be provided.

**HYDRO**

Hydro is in the final stages of obtaining permits for its work. When the necessary permits are in place, Hydro's first construction-related activity will be to mark "locates" to ensure that gas, electrical and other services near an excavation area are accurately located and marked.
