CONSTRUCTION NOTICE #6: Martin Goodman Trail Connection & Jarvis Dockwall Reinforcement

Stage One: Week of November 12 to November 16, 2012

Jarvis Dockwall Reinforcement

Construction crews will continue to weld steel beams and casings used for the dockwall reinforcement. Caisson drilling is expected to resume this week.

What to Expect:

Caisson drilling involves a large drill rig which is used to drill a hole into the ground and insert a re-bar cage into the hole. Concrete is then poured around the rebar to fill the hole. The result is a reinforced column embedded in the ground which forms part of the foundation for the structure.

Pedestrian and Vehicle

Access:

There will be truck movements in and out of the site, but no major traffic impacts are expected. Pedestrian access will be maintained at all times.

Interim Martin Goodman Trail Connection

All utility locates have now been received and construction crews are expected to begin mobilizing equipment on site. Sidewalk demolition and asphalt grinding will begin on the south side of Queens Quay, just east of Yonge Street and the condominiums at Pier 27.

What to Expect:

When demolition work begins, by mid-week, crews will begin the saw cutting of the south side concrete curbs, and asphalt surfaces. The debris and materials will be removed from site by dump trucks. Construction noise should be expected with this work (within the City's Construction Noise Bylaw). Crews will mobilize beginning at 7am., each day, but noisy work, as agreed with local stakeholders, will not begin until 8am.

Pedestrian and Vehicle Access:

A short stretch of the eastbound curb lane will be closed to traffic. Traffic barrels will be used to mark this localized work area. Pedestrian access will be maintained with alternative diversion paths provided.

LOOK AHEAD: UPCOMING WORK

- Eastern/Waterfront Toronto: Caisson drilling will continue.
- Martin Goodman Trail Connection: Sidewalk demolition and asphalt grinding will continue moving east.
