CONSTRUCTION NOTICE #19: Martin Goodman Trail Connection June 10, 2013 to June 14, 2013

Eastern Construction's sub-contractor – Coco Paving – has completed the concrete sidewalk between Lower Jarvis Streets and just east of Lower Yonge Street. The sidewalk is pending final approval and is expected to open early this week.

The new Martin Goodman Trail, which runs parallel to the sidewalk, is nearly complete. Waterfront Toronto is coordinating our final construction activities around Hydro work at the Yonge Slip and servicing for the new Pier 27 condo development. Crews are expected to begin construction in these remaining areas on June 11. Once completed, the Martin Goodman Trail will officially open.

The infrastructure for the new signalized intersection at Lower Sherbourne and Queens Quay East has now been completed. These signals allow safe crossing of Queens Quay from the north and south sides of the street. The signals are expected to be operational by the end of the month.

What to Expect:

Crews will begin the final section of new sidewalk and MGT bike lanes at the Yonge Street slip area.

Over the next few weeks, crews will also complete permanent line markings.

Crews are completing the installation of granite pavers along the head of the Jarvis Slip. The reinstatement of the guardrail, installation of new light poles and asphalt paving will also occur. This work is scheduled for completion next week.

Some construction and equipment noise can be expected with the work that remains to be completed.

Pedestrian and Vehicle Access:

Two-way traffic will be maintained along Queens Quay, but some short term lane diversions will be required when crews are painting the bike paths and completing final detail landscape work. Traffic barrels will be used to mark these localized work areas and their progress along Queens Quay.

All driveways will be maintained during construction. Pedestrian access will be maintained on the northside of Queens Quay with alternative diversion paths marked with signage.

LOOK AHEAD: UPCOMING WORK

- Permanent line markings and custom buffer work to be completed
- Remaining section of new sidewalks & MGT bike trail to be completed at the Yonge St. slip.
- Granite installation, guardrail reinstatement, light pole installation & asphalt paving will continue at the Jarvis Head of Slip
