**UPDATED CONSTRUCTION UPDATE #11: Queens Quay Revitalization
Stage One: Week of August 13th to August 17th 2012**

TTC

All transit priority signals have been deactivated along Queens Quay. This includes the signal at the York/Queens Quay intersection which was repaired last week.

For the week of August 13, TTC crews will begin work within the Harbourfront portal. Work includes the removal of overhead wiring on the portal's exit/entry ramp located just west of Bay St. TTC trucks and crews will occupy the track right-of-way and ramp area during this work.

Pedestrian and Vehicle Access:

There will be no disruption to pedestrian or vehicle access along Queens Quay.

BELL

Distinct Technical Services - DTS (Bell's subcontractor) will undertake remediation work to resolve issues with some existing ducts and conduit parallel to Queens Quay, just west of York Street. This work is scheduled to begin on Wednesday, August 15th and is expected to be complete by the end of the week.

What to Expect:

The work zone is approximately 200 metres long and will be located on Queens Quay within the north-side curb lane and sidewalk area just west of the York Street intersection. One westbound traffic lane, adjacent to the sidewalk will be closed to traffic.

Several small pits will be excavated on the public sidewalk area along Queens Quay and immediately adjacent to the concrete curb. These pits are required for DTS Crews to access to blocked conduit pipes.

Pedestrian and Vehicle Access:

Fast fence and traffic barrels will be installed around the work area. There will minimal disturbances to pedestrian access due to the ample sidewalk space in this area. One westbound lane of Queens Quay will be closed to vehicle traffic. Paid duty police officers will be on site directing traffic as necessary.

LOOK AHEAD: UPCOMING WORK

- Bell: The cable installation schedule is being reviewed with work expected next week.
- TTC: Construction and remediation work will continue in the portal.
- Toronto Hydro: When Toronto Hydro obtains its permits for work, the "locate of services" will begin on Queens Quay.
